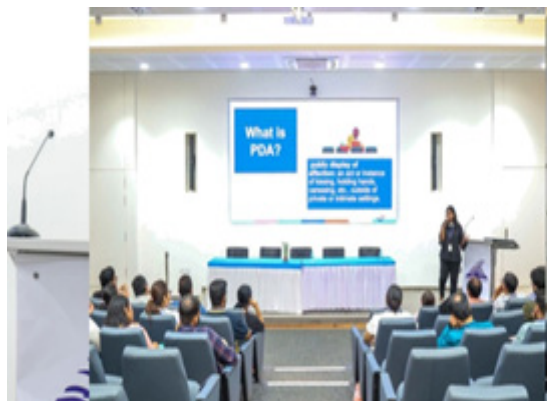

FACULTY SENSITISATION SESSION ON RESPECTFUL INTERVENTIONS

Presidency School of Liberal Arts and Sciences organised a faculty sensitisation session titled “Respectful Interventions: Addressing Student PDA with Care and Professionalism” on **October 11, 2025**. The session was conducted by **Ms. Namratha Jessica, University Campus Counsellor, DSA**. The session aimed to help faculty members understand how to approach and manage instances of **Public Display of Affection (PDA)** among students with awareness, sensitivity, and professionalism.

Ms. Jessica elaborated on the appropriate boundaries for student interactions, urging faculty to approach such situations with sensitivity and awareness and explaining how to intervene in cases of **misconduct or non-consensual behaviour**. She guided students toward emotional maturity and responsible boundaries and also encouraged them to seek support from the **Mind Blossom Club** for mental health and well-being. The session concluded with an engaging Q&A segment, where faculty members shared real-life situations and sought practical guidance.

The discussion fostered a collective understanding that disciplinary measures should be balanced with empathy, ensuring that the campus remains both respectful and compassionate.

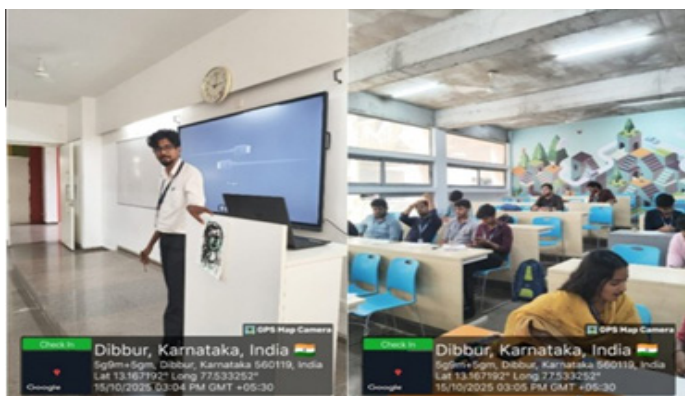


CHIP TO CROP: 24-HOUR AGRITECH HACKATHON

The **MakerSpace, Build Club**, in collaboration with the **Indian Institute of Horticultural Research (IIHR), Bangalore**, successfully organised the “**Chip to Crop**” 24-hour AgriTech Hackathon on **October 14-15, 2025**. The hackathon aimed to bring together undergraduate students from diverse engineering and science disciplines to innovate sustainable technological solutions in agriculture — addressing real-world challenges from **farm automation to crop health monitoring**.

The event began with an inaugural session introducing participants to the objectives of the hackathon and the importance of “**AgriTech for Sustainable Futures**”. Students participated in teams of 4-6 members, brainstorming and developing prototypes that **integrated IoT, AI, machine learning, and embedded systems** to enhance agricultural productivity and efficiency. The event also featured **mentorship sessions by IIHR scientists** and university faculty who guided the teams throughout the 24-hour build phase.





IELTS MASTERCLASS

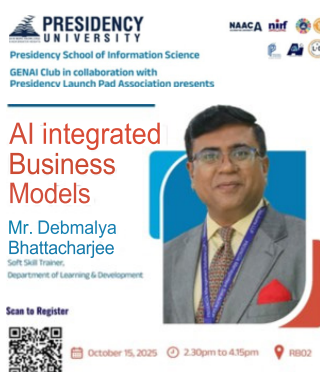

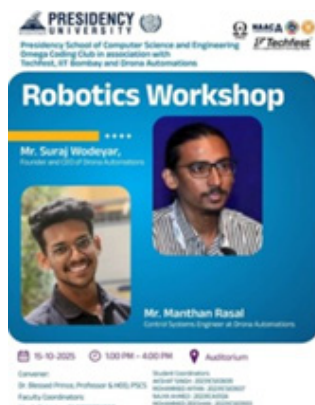


ROBOTICS WORKSHOP

The event was coordinated by assistant professors, **Ms. A. Rohini** and **Dr. Serin V. Simpson**.

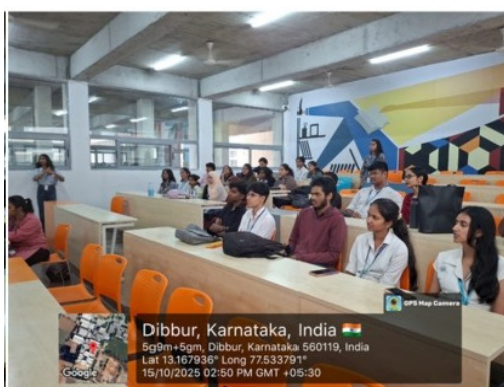
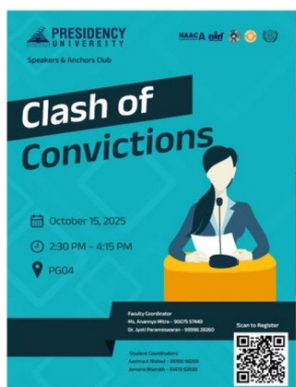


CLASH OF CONVICTIONS

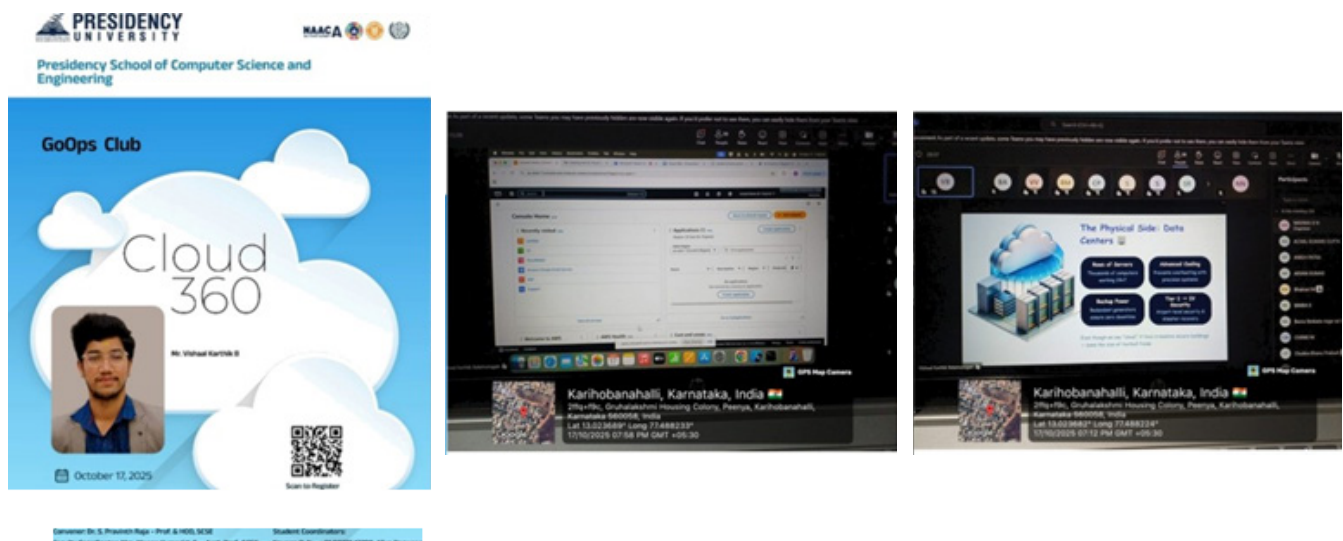


CLOUD 360

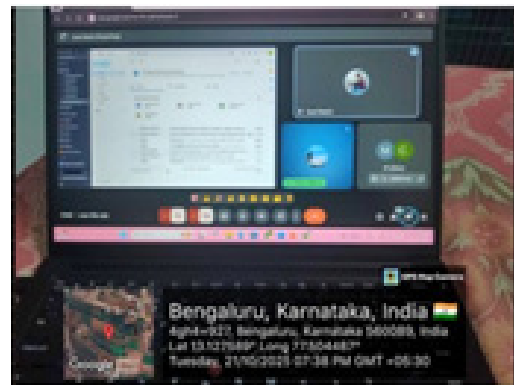
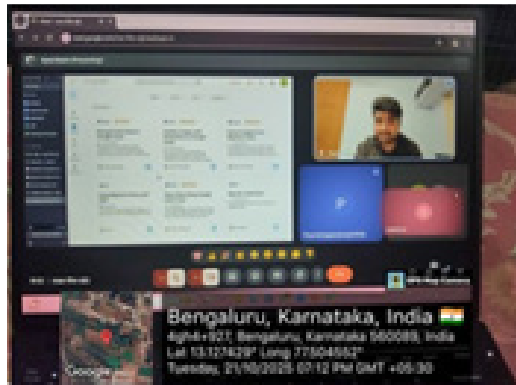
The interactive session included a **live demonstration** of **AWS Free Tier** usage and practical discussions on how cloud solutions empower modern software systems.

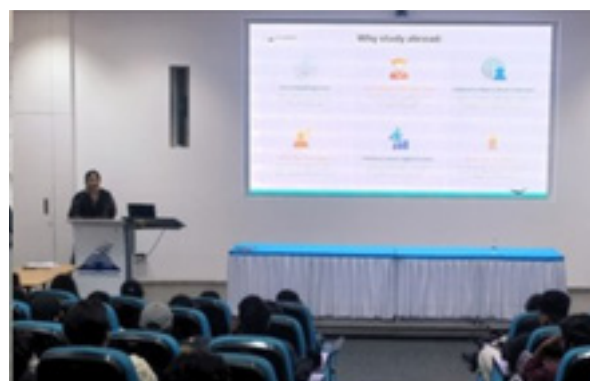
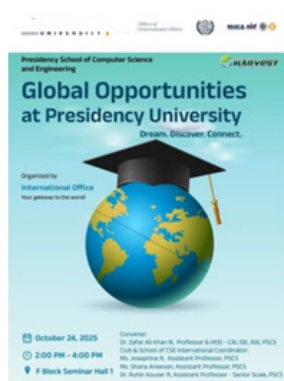
GLOBAL OPPORTUNITIES AT PRESIDENCY UNIVERSITY

By the end of the session, participants gained a clearer understanding of the opportunities offered by **Presidency University** to enhance their academic journey and build internationally competitive professional profiles.



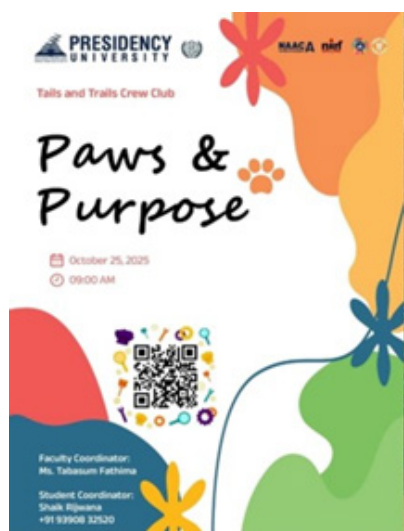
PAWS & PURPOSE - A VISIT TO PFA WILDLIFE RESCUE CENTRE

The **Tails and Trails Crew Club**, an animal welfare club, organised “**Paws & Purpose**”—an enlightening visit to the **People for Animals (PFA) Wildlife Rescue & Rehabilitation Centre, Bengaluru**, on **October 25, 2025**.

The visit offered students a firsthand experience of how PFA, a non-profit organisation, rescues, treats, and rehabilitates injured wild animals with compassion and care. Students learnt about innovative treatments such as electric acupuncture for reptiles and imping, a surgical feather replacement technique that helps injured birds fly again — supported by the centre’s unique “**Feather Bank**”.

The PFA team shared insights into their rescue operations, supported by ambulances and trained volunteers who respond promptly to distress calls. Having completed over **45,000 successful rescues** spanning **231 species**, PFA continues to lead the way in wildlife conservation through its **4R approach — Rescue, Recovery, Rehabilitation, and Release**.

The event inspired students to understand the importance of animal welfare, urban biodiversity, and sustainable coexistence—truly living up to its name, “Paws & Purpose”.

UNDER 25- SUMMIT AT CAMPUS

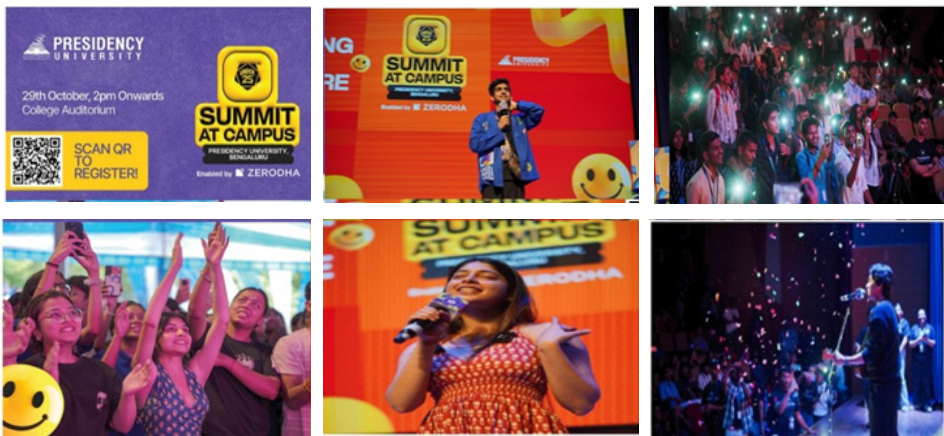
