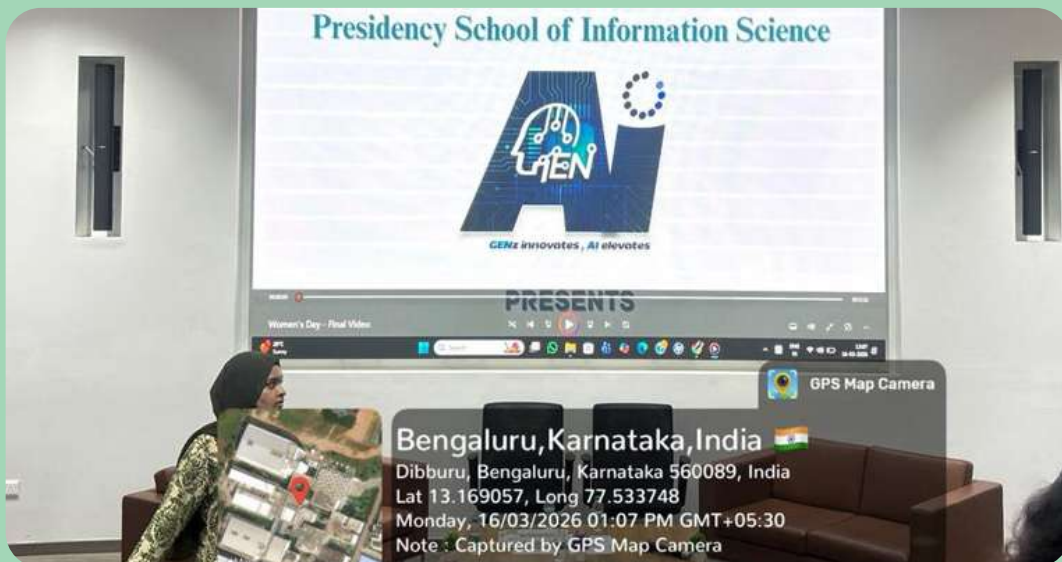

DRONES: RC PLANE BOT BUILDING WORKSHOP

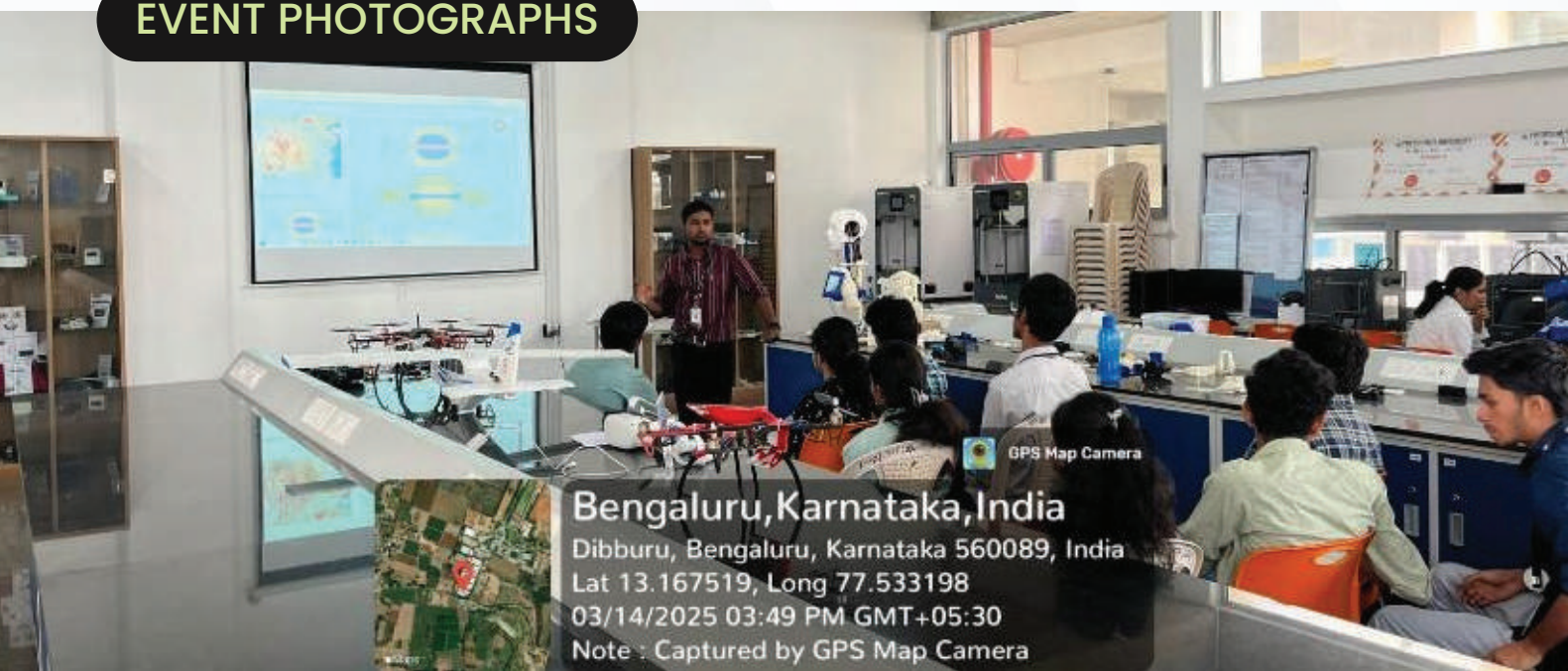



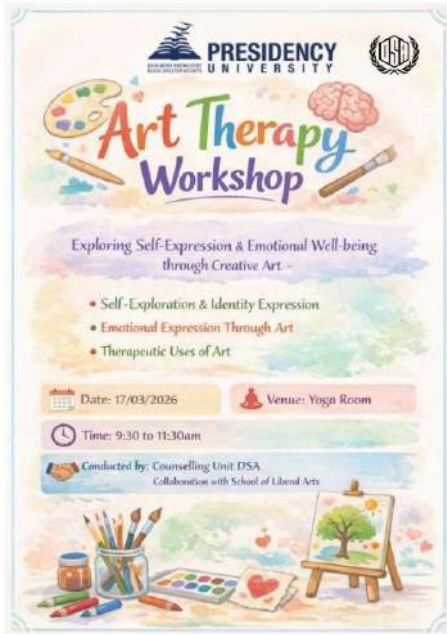

DEVOPS DECODE – PUZZLE GAME

The DevOps Decode (Puzzle Game) event was designed as a structured technical competition aimed at introducing participants to practical DevOps concepts through an interactive and problem-solving approach. Round 3 – Rapid-Fire Technical Finale: Finalists participated in an interactive rapid-fire round involving advanced DevOps concepts and real-world deployment scenarios, evaluating quick thinking, technical clarity, and decision-making under pressure.

The event received positive feedback from participants for its engaging and practical approach to learning DevOps concepts. Participants appreciated the structured rounds and real-world problem scenarios. The event was coordinated by Samuel Joshua (President, GoOps Club) and Achal Kumari Gupta (Vice President, GoOps Club).

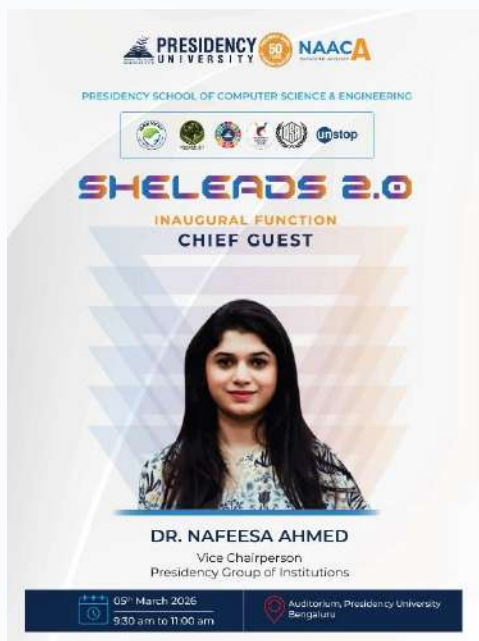

The event ran from 8:30 AM on 5th March 2026 to 4:00 PM on 6th March 2026, in the Auditorium, L Block, 4th Floor. It aimed to create a powerful platform for women innovators, developers, and entrepreneurs to showcase their technical capabilities and leadership skills.



The hackathon attracted enthusiastic participation from students across multiple universities. After a competitive screening process, 50 teams were shortlisted and invited to participate in the final 24-hour hackathon. The event was inaugurated by Dr. Nissar Ahmed, Chancellor, and Dr. Nafeesa Ahmed, Vice Chairperson. WALL STREET REWIND

"Wall Street Rewind – Recreating Iconic Moments in Global Financial History" was organised by the School of Management (MBA) on 4th March 2026, from 9:45 AM to 11:45 AM at MF 10. The event was designed to deepen MBA students' understanding of major financial crises, bubbles, and regulatory turning points through experiential simulation, connecting theoretical finance concepts with real-world historical events.



The event was structured into multiple engaging phases including orientation, team allocation, research mentoring, rehearsal rounds, and final performances. Each team was assigned a landmark financial event such as the 2008 Subprime Mortgage Crisis and the 1973 Oil Crisis.
