Proceedings

The meeting commenced with a warm welcome extended by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to all the members. He also introduced Mr. Vinay Pai, External Expert Member (Employer Representative), who has been inducted into the IQAC of Presidency University. The Vice Chancellor appreciated the contributions of all stakeholders and reiterated the University's vision of achieving academic and operational excellence through sustained quality initiatives.

He emphasized the pivotal role of the IQAC in steering Presidency University toward national and global benchmarks of quality and performance. The Vice Chancellor also congratulated all members on the University's achievements in securing ranks in the NIRF 2025 (Management and Engineering disciplines) and in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2026.

After confirming the quorum, the Chairperson called the meeting to order.

Agenda 27.1: Confirmation of the Minutes of Twenty-Sixth IQAC Meeting held on June 25, 2025 and Action taken report on it.

The minutes of the 26th meeting held on 25th June 2025, along with the Action Taken Report (Annexure-27.1), were presented and reviewed. The Chairperson commended the IQAC team for systematically following up on recommendations and ensuring effective implementation.

Resolution:

Resolved that the minutes and action taken report of the 26th IQAC meeting held on June 25, 2025 as placed before the Members as Annexure-27.1 be and are hereby confirmed and approved.

Agenda 27.2: Report and Review of "NIRF 2025 ranking outcomes"- Presidency University, Bengaluru, covering performance across all participated disciplines and parameters

The IQAC presented a comprehensive report on the NIRF 2025 ranking outcomes (Annexure-27.2), detailing the performance across all participating disciplines and parameters. The noteworthy improvement across all metrics was duly acknowledged. The Chairperson commended the faculty for their sustained dedication, which has significantly enhanced the University's research profile and contributed to its improved standing in national rankings. He congratulated all members on the University's achievement in securing positions in the NIRF 2025 Rankings — Management discipline (Band 101-125) and Engineering discipline (Band 201-300). Further, members opined that introducing special scholarship schemes for girl students would enhance enrollment, attract more female students, and promote inclusivity. Members also recommended that efforts be made to reach out to a wider network of academic peers to improve the institution's perception score.

Resolution:

Resolved that the NIRF 2025 ranking outcomes-Presidency University, Bengaluru, covering performance across all participated disciplines and parameters as placed before the Members as Annexure-27.2 be taken on record and faculty contributions be appreciated.

Carried Unanimously

Agenda 27.3: Report and Review on "THE Times World University Rankings 2026" results

The outcomes of the THE Times World University Rankings 2026 were presented (Annexure-27.3). Presidency University, Bengaluru has been ranked globally in the 1501+ band and secured the 98th position at the national level.

The Associate Director, IQAC presented a detailed analysis of the results, highlighting that 3,118 institutions worldwide participated in the ranking exercise, including 163 institutions from India, with 2,191 institutions ranked across 115 countries.

Members appreciated and congratulated the IQAC for their dedicated efforts in aligning the University's institutional metrics with global ranking frameworks and for enhancing its international visibility. However, members opined that the University should engage international faculty and students as part of the team to strengthen outcomes in global rankings. The Chairperson appreciated the faculty members for their significant contributions to the University's research output, which played a key role in **Presidency University's inclusion** in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2026.

Resolution:

Resolved that the achievement in the international ranking, as placed before the Members in **Annexure–27.3**, be taken on record, and that the efforts of the IQAC and data teams be duly appreciated.

Carried Unanimously

Agenda 27.4: Analysis and Review of "Student Feedback on Institutional Support" for the Academic Year 2024-25 of Presidency University, Bengaluru.

Based on the Members' suggestions to implement a structured 360-degree Student Feedback System for a comprehensive assessment of the teaching—learning process and overall campus experience, the Student Feedback on Institutional Support survey was revised accordingly, complementing the existing Student Satisfaction Survey.

The results of the survey, conducted through Linways ERP, were presented (Annexure–27.4), covering key areas such as Academic Support, Learning–Teaching (as suggested by members), Assessment and Evaluation Methods, Infrastructure, and Student Support Services

Members appreciated the transparency and depth of the analysis and encouraged the IQAC to initiate timely corrective and enhancement measures based on the feedback received, particularly regarding scheduling gym facility timings separately for different genders.

Resolution:

Resolved that the results of the Student Feedback on Institutional Support survey, as placed before the Members in **Annexure–27.4**, be taken on record, and that the IQAC initiate appropriate follow-up actions based on the feedback outcomes.

Carried Unanimously

Agenda 27.5: Report and Review on various IQAC Activities & Initiatives

A report on the recent IQAC initiatives since the last meeting was presented (Annexure-27.5), highlighting the successful organization of two workshops, two Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), and one orientation program. The Members acknowledged and appreciated these efforts, recognizing their contribution to strengthening the quality culture across the University's various schools.

Resolution:

Resolved that the report on the IQAC initiatives, as placed before the Members in **Annexure-27.5**, be taken on record, and that the commitment and contributions of the IQAC team and resource faculty be duly appreciated and highly commended.

Carried Unanimously

Agenda 27.6: Participation in THE Awards Asia 2026 & Times Higher Education (THE) Sustainability Impact Rating 2026.

The members were informed that, as part of the University's quality enhancement initiatives, the IQAC successfully participated in and submitted data (*Annexure-27.6*) for the Times Higher Education (THE) Awards Asia 2026 under the category "Teaching and Learning Strategy of the Year", and the results are awaited.

The IQAC is also in the process of submitting data for the Times Higher Education (THE) Sustainability Impact Rating 2026 under SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation), SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities), and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals).

Members commended the IQAC for its efforts in aligning the University's institutional metrics with global ranking frameworks and enhancing its international visibility. Members recommended focusing on specific SDGs that align with the University's strengths and priority areas, instead of engaging uniformly across all SDGs.

Resolution:

Resolved that the initiatives of the IQAC in submitting data for the *Times Higher Education* (*THE*) Awards Asia 2026 and the *THE Sustainability Impact Rating 2026*, as placed before the Members in Annexure-27.6, be noted, and the IQAC's dedicated efforts in aligning the University's institutional metrics with global ranking frameworks and enhancing its international visibility be duly appreciated.

Carried Unanimously

Agenda 27.7: Any Other Matter with Permission of the Chair

The following suggestions were put forward and recorded:

- The members recommended the adoption of the "One Health Concept" to promote integrated initiatives addressing human and environmental health.
- It was resolved to move beyond the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by embedding ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance) principles within the University's institutional policies and practices.
- The members advised the establishment of comprehensive MoUs covering all Schools and Departments to strengthen cross-disciplinary collaborations and external partnerships.
- The members recommended the formation of an Institutional Development Plan (IDP)
 Task Force comprising external experts and internal members, to guide, oversee, and evaluate the implementation of strategic and developmental initiatives.
- The members recommended conducting a Faculty Orientation on Binary Accreditation Framework [BAF] after the manual is released, to ensure uniform understanding and implementation.
- Introduction of Spanish as a language of study

These ideas were positively received and will be reviewed by IQAC for action in the upcoming cycle.

Conclusion & Vote of Thanks

The meeting concluded with a heartfelt Vote of Thanks delivered by Dr. Badri H. S., Associate Director, IQAC, who expressed gratitude to the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Registrar, Senior Leadership Team, Deans, Faculty Members, and External Members for their continued guidance and commitment. He reiterated the IQAC's commitment to strengthening quality assurance frameworks in alignment with national and global best practices.
