- To install harmonic filter to use quality power supply as per requirement
- It is appreciated to use LED Lighting luminaries in different location of campus
- Install occupancy /Motion sensor in VC cabin, Professor cabin and Offices to save energy
- To install energy saving BLDC Fan
- To install digital telemetry enable water flow meter in bore well and other water supply pumps to monitor water abstraction and consumption in different application.
- There is a potential to install nearly 718 kWp of roof top grid connected Solar Power plant, which will generate about 2439 units every day or nearly 60997 kWh monthly and 731965 kWh per Year
- To install 488 kW solar plant and Payback Analysis for Net Zero Emission on University building roof area

### **Suggestions and Recommendations**

- · To provide with adequate visual and tactile warning
- Slip-resistant surface; should be designed not to allow water accumulating on the walking surface
- Lifts should be marked with the symbol of accessibility and directional signs be provided to the lifts.
- The lift should have a voice announcement system along with a visual display to indicate the floor level and also the information that the door of the cage is open or closed for entrance or exit. The announcement system should be clearly audible i.e. the announcement should be 50 decibel.
- Presence of wide gratings that hinder wheelchair movement, absence of appropriate railings.

Specifics of the Proposed Reforms

- Amalgamate Programme-Accreditation and Institution-Accreditation, considering their inter-dependency; and evolve a Composite Assessment System (with due compliance to the accepted conditions of the Washington Accord).
- 2. Enable Choice-based Ranking System for Diverse Users
- 3. Transition from the present 8-point grading system of NAAC to an 'Adapted Binary Accreditation System'
- 4. Mentor the Institutions falling 'far below the standards for accreditation'.
- 5. Encourage accredited Institutions to raise their bar gradually to:
  - 'Level 1' to 'Level 4' of Institutes of National Excellence, [moving up as they evolve 'in-depth in their disciplines' and/or in-breadth in disciplines]
  - o 'Level-5' for Multi-Disciplinary Research and Educational Institutions of global standing (as envisioned in NEP 2020)

### Specifics of the Proposed Reforms

- 6. Simplify the Accreditation process, especially for the first cycle. Periodicity for Reaccreditation may be brought down to three-year cycle (from five years as followed now).
- 7. Include all HEIs and every programme in the newly proposed assessment and accreditation system, with due regard for their statutory dispensations (e.g. IITs).
- 8. Consider the heterogeneity of HEIs in the country, categorise them based on their orientation/vision and heritage/legacy, and then seek information from the HEIs that are appropriate to their category (rather than a one-size-fits-all model in vogue currently).
- Accredit with due consideration for Inputs, Processes, Outcomes and Impact across different attributes of HEI, encompassing (i) curricular aspects, (ii) selection of faculty, (iii) teaching, (iv) research and innovation, (v) community engagement, (vi) extracurricular and co-curricular activities, (vii) green Initiatives, (vii) governance and administrative practices.

### Specifics of the Proposed Reforms

- 10. Develop a 'Unified Elicitation Tool' to collect the superset of data from HEIs for varied purposes (of approval, accreditation, scoring/ranking) with in-built design for collateral cross-checking to ensure authenticity of data, and, in conjunction with it
- 11. Trust Institutions (along with significant penalty for wrong submissions) and ensure public disclosure of relevant data by HEIs, to enhance the overall process-credibility
- 12. Initiate a robust outreach mechanism in tandem with effective methods of handholding the potential entrants (which is the large majority now), where the aim should be to facilitate all HEIs in the country towards joining the process of accreditation and ranking at the earliest.
